RULES FOR PAYMENT OF FEE BY PG STUDENT OF THE UNIVERSITY DEPARTMENTS

The following are the rules with regard to payment of fee by the students pursuing P.G. Courses on the Campus

- Last date for payment of tuition fee and other fee relating to second and further semesters will be as follows:
 - a) Without Fine up to 15 working days from the date of commencement of classes
 - b) With a fine of Rs.25/- per working day from 16th working day from the date of commencement of classes, but on or before the 30th working day (Fine should be calculated from the 16th working day onwards)
- 2. Any PG student, who fails to pay the fee even with fine within the 30th working day from the date of commencement of classes, shall be removed from the rolls and her/his admission shall be cancelled. The Heads of Departments are authorized to issue the circulars relating to removal of candidates from the nominal rolls. A copy of the circular will be sent to the Registrar and Finance Officer for information. Those candidates shall apply for re-admission through the Head of the Department and if re-admitted, they have to pay the re-admission fee of Rs.1000/- along with a penalty of Rs.25/- per day from the 16th working day. List of candidates who have paid fee shall be maintained in the Departments with due entries about the receipt No., date of payment, amount paid etc, in the register provided by the Registrar
- 3. The period of removal from the rolls will be treated as absent for calculating the percentage of attendance earned by the candidate in that semester. The list of candidates removed from roll will be displayed in the Department Notice Board with copies to Registrar and Finance Officer.
- 4. An undertaking shall be given by such candidates that they will not repeat the same in future.
- 5. Re-admission will be considered only if the Head of the Department certifies that the student's conduct and progress is satisfactory and his/her attendance to class is regular.
- 6. The Re-admission of the candidate cannot be claimed as a matter of right as it is the discretion of the Registrar with the recommendation of the concerned Head of the Department.

- 7. The Heads of the Departments should maintain a register styled "Fees Collection Register" separately for PG candidates.
- 8. The Heads of the Departments are responsible to supervise whether the students of their Departments are paying the fee in-time.
- 9. The students, immediately after paying the fee shall produce the receipt to the respective Heads of the Departments for making entries in the Department Fee Register.
- 10. The Heads of the Departments will enter the receipt No., date of remittance of fee and amount paid by the students in the Department Fee Register.
- 11. The Registrar's Office will send a circular to all the Heads of the Departments about the date of commencement of classes, last date for payment of fee etc. relating to PG students.
- 12. As soon as the last date prescribed for payment of fee relating to PG students is over, the candidates who are yet to pay the fee will be removed from the rolls, under intimation to the Registrar and will not be permitted to attend the classes by the Head of the Department.
- 13. The tuition fee and other fee, once paid, will not be refunded under any circumstances.
- 14. Any candidate who leaves the institution in the middle of the course/ academic year cannot claim for refund of any portion of the fee paid already.
- 15. Fee must be paid through Bank of India Challan/DD. Out of 4 copies of the challan except Bank copy, the candidate should submit the department copy and finance section copy to the department and the student's copy must be kept by the student, since it is the evidence for having paid the fee and shall be produced, to the HOD/University office, when requested. Candidates failing to produce the challan may be directed to pay the fee. Remittance of fee in any other mode is not accepted.
- 16. The University reserves the right to revise the rules and fee without any prior intimation.

RULES FOR PAYMENT OF FEE BY M.Phil. & Ph.D. SCHOLARS OF THE UNIVERSITY DEPARTMENTS

The following are the rules with regard to payment of fee by the students pursuing M. Phil./Ph.D. courses on campus

1. Last date for payment of tuition and other fee relating to each year of registration from second year of registration will be as follows

(a) Without fine : Upto 15 working days from the date of commencement of

registration year.

(b) With a fine of Re. 1/-

per working days : From the 16 working days but before the 30 working days from

the date of commencement of Registration Year (Fine shall be

calculated only from the 16th working day onwards).

2. Any Research scholar who fails to pay the fee till the end of 30th working day from the date of commencement of the registration year as said above will have to pay the fine as follows:

a)	On any day after the 30 th working day, during the second month from the date of commencement of registration	Rs.250/- (consolidated) (including fine from the 16 th to 30 th working day)

- 3. Beyond three months upto 6 months from the date of Registration Rs.1,000/- is collected as fine, after getting the approval from the Vice-Chancellor as a Special Case.
- 4. The registration of any scholar who fails to pay the fee within 6 months from the date of commencement of registration year will get automatically cancelled and such candidate will have to seek re-admission by applying for it in the regular application for admission.
- Whenever a scholar registers for M.Phil. Full Time/Part Time programme and is not able to submit his/her dissertation in the prescribed time, he/she has to get extension period for

- submitting his/her dissertations. At that time along with extension fee they have to pay an additional administration fee of Rs.250/- necessarily in favour of the Registrar as well.
- 6. The Heads of the Departments will maintain a register styled Fee Collection Register separately for M.Phil. and Ph.D. Scholars.
- 7. The Heads of the Departments are responsible to supervise whether the scholars of their departments are paying the fee in time.
- 8. The students, immediately after paying

- No circular with regard to last date for payment of fees by M.Phil/Ph.D. Scholars will be sent to the Head of the Department.
- The Heads of the Departments will enter the receipt No., Date of remittance of fee and amount paid by the scholars in the Fees Register.
- 11. Ph.D. Scholars will be registered only on first of July/ November and the admission of Ph.D. Scholars shall be made accordingly to maintain a uniform last date for payment of fee for Ph.D. Candidates.
- 12. For Ph.D. Candidates, the period of one year for remittance of fee will be calculated from the date of registration irrespective of the date of admission. (Eg: For Ph.D. Candidates registered on 1-7-2016, the First year of registration commences on 1-7-2016 and the Second year of registration commences on 1-7-2017 etc.).
- 13. For M.Phil., scholars, 31st October of next academic year will be taken as the date of completion of one year for a candidate admitted during the previous academic year. (Eg. For candidates admitted to M.Phil., during 2015-2016, one year period gets completed on 30-10-2016 and the next year on 30-10-2016 etc.)
- 14. M.Phil. and Ph.D. Scholars shall remit the tuition fee and other fee in addition to extension fee for the period of extension of time for completing the requirements of the programme.

- 15. All Ph.D./M.Phil. Scholars shall obtain a certificate from the Hostel Warden as furnished in annexure II about no dues to the Hostel and submit the same to the H.O.D. at the time of submission of Thesis/Dissertation.
- 16. Based on the certificate said above and the entries in the fees register in the Department, the HOD. will issue a certificate to M.Phil./Ph.D scholars in the formats furnished in Annexure I that the scholar has paid all fees due to the University and to the hostel. Such a certificate shall be submitted to the Controller of Examinations along with the Ph.D./M.Phil. Dissertation. The Controller of Examination will not process the dissertation until he/she receives such certificate.
- 17. The tuition fee and other fee, once paid, will not be refunded under any circumstances.
- 18. Any scholar who leaves the institution in the middle cannot claim for refund of any portion of the fee paid already.
- 19. Fee must be paid personally at the Finance Section only and the receipt must be kept by the student since it is the evidence to the student for having paid the fee and xerox copy shall be produced to the HOD/University Office. Candidates failing to produce the receipt may be directed to pay fee. Remittance of fee in any other mode is not accepted.

ABSTRACT OF CBCS REGULATIONS

Elective and Supportive Papers

Each PG programme is having core, elective and supportive courses/papers having credits from 2 to 5 depending on their lecture hours per week. While core paper is exclusively offered in the parent department, the supportive papers are offered only by other departments. The elective paper may be from their parent/other departments as well. All the courses/papers may/may not have practical training as decided by the programme committee.

Duration and Structure of the Programme

I) The minimum and maximum periods for the completion of a programme are given:

ii). The minimum number of credits to be earned for the successful completion of the 2 year full time (e.g. M.Sc.) and 3 year full time (e.g.: M.C.A./M.Tech) programmes normally are 90 and 135 respectively, which should include a minimum number of credits 6 from the supportive courses and 12 from the elective courses. At least one elective/supportive course one must be offered in the first three semesters. The remaining 72 credits are allotted to core papers/course offered by the parent departments. This includes theory, practical and project. Normally the project is conducted in the 4th semester. As a special case, 72 credits may also include Field trip or Industrial Visit. The MBA programme which comes under AICTE norms however will have a minimum of 128 credits (3200) for its successful completion. Keeping the diverse input of candidates in MBA, all elective courses are offered only in the III & IV semesters. Thus, core paper alone will be taught in the I and II semesters of MBA.

Semester wise Registration

The student has to register for opted courses/papers with the respective faculty, after due announcement of the prescribed dates and the beginning/commencement of each semester.

On joining the University, each student is assigned to a faculty advisor. The student can register for course(s) which he/she intends to take during a given semester on the basis of the programme for each discipline as given in the course of the study bulletin and as per the advise given by his/her faculty adviser. The faculty adviser is expected to discuss with the student and then decide the nature of the courses for which the students can register during the semester within the framework of the guidelines (Scheme of Examinations).

Procedure for Registration

The registration schedule is announced in advance by the HOD. Students should contact the respective faculty adviser of their department for guidance and registration. The student adviser on the

instruction of HOD can suggest possible elective/supportive course(s) for registration by the candidate. In any case, registration must be completed on or before the prescribed last date for registration. Students having outstanding dues to the institute or a hostel, shall not be permitted to register. Late registration may be permitted for certain period only, for valid reason and on payment of a late registration fee prescribed from time to time by CBCS office. However, if a student fails to register during any semester, his/her studentship is liable to be cancelled.

M.B.B.S./B.D.S. or equivalent with at least 60% marks and one year internship;

OR

B.Pharm./B.V.Sc./B.Sc.(Ag) or equivalent degree with at least 55% marks and one publication in SCI Journal and should have completed at least three years research experience;

Dr. D. S KOTHARI POST DOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP IN SCIENCES

Post-doctoral research is an important enabling step in grooming young researchers for launching an academic/research career. This is a transition phase from a largely supervisor directed student at doctoral level to an independent researcher for leadership position, particularly in academia and offers a platform for transiting into cross-disciplinary areas.

Eligibility

Candidates who have either received a Ph. D. degree or submitted their Ph. D. thesis are eligible to apply. When selected, those holding the Ph. D. degree will be directly awarded the named PDF. Those who have submitted their Ph. D. thesis may be awarded a 'bridging fellowship' (with marginally reduced stipend) until they are formally awarded the Ph. D. Degree.

The fellowship is awarded on a yearly basis with renewal/termination clause on the basis of PDF mentor/peer group appraisal, the maximum duration of the PDF award would be 3 years. Candidates should give an undertaking while availing the award, along with endorsement or the research mentor, that they would stay in place for a minimum of six months.

UGC-HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT CENTRE

The UGC-Human Resource Development Centre (formerly Academic Staff College) was established in the year 1987 with cent percent financial assistance from the University Grants Commission. It has conducted 110 Orientation programmes for the benefit of nearly 3700 Higher Education teachers since 1987. And 7900 teachers have been benefited by 271 Refresher Courses conducted by our Human Resource Development Centre in various branches such as Science, Arts, Humanities, Social Sciences, Commerce, Languages, etc., 14,000 teachers of college and Universities were trained by our Human Resource Development Centre.

Moreover, 60 other Special Programmes and Workshops are also conducted by the Human Resource Development Centre. Computer Training, Training on Functional English to the Administrative Staff of this University, Training for Librarians, short term and interaction programme for the scholars and Workshop for College Principals are included in the special programmes. It has also conducted the Orientation Courses for the Engineering College teachers with financial assistance from AICTE. Two Workshops were organized for 150 Research Guides and Supervisors. It paved way to learn the methods of research in Science and Social science in the 21 day Interaction Programme for Ph.D. Students which benefited about 350 Ph.D. Scholars through the UGC- Human Resource Development Centre, Bharathiar University.

The UGC- Human Resource Development Centre of the Bharathiar University aims at maintaining the top most status at the National level, not only interms of number of programmes organized but also interms of quality and variety. To accomplish this task, training in INFLIBNET-INFONET, EDUSAT exposure, e-learning and e-content development is also provided to the participants.

Apart from the academic side, the HRDC has jointly organized the National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content (N-LIST) programme funded by the MHRD, New Delhi with co-ordination of the Information and Library Network Centre, an Autonomous Inter-University Centre of UGC, Ahmadabad for the benefit of Librarians of the Colleges and Universities. It also conducted a programme for non-teaching staff members of CTI (Central Training Institute), Chennai & Mumbai with the sponsorship of CTI.

National Assessment and Accreditation Council, Bangalore reviewed the performance of all the Human Resource Development Centres in the country during February & March 2012. It made a detailed assessment of the curriculum, teaching methods/ infrastructure facilities and other innovation practices of all the Human Resource Development Centres in the country. The NAAC has rated with 55 marks, and UGC - Human Resource Development Centre, Bharathiar University is placed 12th at National level among 66 ASCs and UGC-Human Resource Development Centre, Bharathiar University placed 1st among the four HRDCs functioning in Tamil Nadu State.

In the Academic year 2015-16, 4 Orientation programmes, 7 Refresher courses including 1 Need Based Refresher Course, 6 Short term courses and 3 other programmes were approved by the UGC. Out of these, the HRDC has completed 4 Orientation programmes, 7 Refresher Courses including one Need Based Refresher Course and one other programme.

The Bharathiar University hospital is fully equipped with latest equipments such as Medonic M20 cell counter machine, Microlab 300 semi auto analyser, ECG machine, Nebulizer, Pulse oximeter, uriscan optimize analyzer etc., One doctor from PSG is deputed to our hospital from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon and 4:00 p.m. to 07:00 p.m. and the two university staff nurses are working in our hospital from 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. in all university working days. 24 hours ambulance facilities are available in university campus to serve students and staff of the university.

INTERNET CENTRE

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has been helping Universities through general as well as specific schemes to keep pace with the developments in the Information and Communication Technologies. UGC has been assisting universities for setting up of internet centre for research & training and in application of computers in every field/subject. Towards these objectives, Bharathiar University has established Internet centre in the Year 1996.

The purpose of internet centre is for the growth and development of teaching, research and other related activities. The centre will work from 8.00 a.m. to 8.00 p.m. on every working day for the purpose of meeting the students needs regarding the usage of internet services.

RULES TO BE FOLLOWED BY THE STUDENTS

When using the services of internet centre, students have to follow the rules regarding discipline as well as instructions for how to use the centre, how to take care of the equipments and furniture in the centre. To utilize the internet centre effectively and efficiently by all the campus students, PG students are allowed to work for continuous 45 minutes and Research Scholars are provided with one hour for utilizing internet service per day.

OBJECTIVES OF THE INTERNET CENTRE

- To provide a central computing facility with network server for all students and staff of the University.
- To make the facility available and offer possible assistance in conducting research, analyzing data etc.
- To organize and conduct short term courses for the students and staff of the University.
- To assist various departments in the University in computerizing their activities.
- To keep track of the latest developments in computer hardware/software technologies, internet technologies and collect information, acquire and import knowledge to the University staff.
- To develop human resource in the field of Information and Communication Technology.

FACILITIES

The centre is equipped with 105 latest configuration systems along with one HP and two HCL higher end severs (HCL Xcel ,HP and Global), all powered with six 5 KVA UPS, one

4KVA UPS and one 2 KVA UPS along with broad band internet facility. The centre is also equipped with scanner, External CD Writer, IP Phone, one Line matrix printer, 2 laser printer and 2 Dot matrix printers. Licensed version of softwares available in the internet centre includes Windows 98, Redhat Linux and Windows XP.

TECHNOLOGY

DHCP (Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol) is a communication protocol that lets network administrators centrally manage and automate the assignment of Internet Protocol (IP) addresses of the internet centre. Using the internet protocol, each machine can connect to the internet needs unique IP address, which is assigned when an internet connection is created for a specific computer. Without DHCP, the IP address must be entered manually at each computer in an organization and a new IP address must be entered each time when a computer moves to a new location on the network point.

DHCP uses the concept of a "lease" amount of time that a given IP address will be valid for a computer. The lease time can vary depending on how long a user is likely to require the internet connection at a particular location. It is especially useful in education and other environment where users change frequently. Using very short leases, DHCP can dynamically reconfigure network in which there are more computers than there are available IP address. The protocols also supports static addresses for computer that need a permanent IP address such as Web Server.

QUOTA FOR SPORTS AND PHYSICALLY CHALLENGED

One seat is reserved for permanently disabled candidates and one for sports person for admission into each of the programmes.

Candidates seeking admission under Physically Handicapped quota shall produce a Medical Certificate about his/her permanent physical disability by an orthopedic surgeon in the rank of an Assistant Surgeon. The candidates under this category will be selected on the basis of his/her scoring in Tamilnadu Common Entrance Test and such candidates should physically be able to undergo the course.

Candidates seeking admission undergo sports quota will be selected on the basis of their performance/representation at the following levels:

- Participation at the International level, the candidate should have been sponsored by a national organization.
- Participation at the National level, the candidate should have been sponsored by a State Organisation
- . Participation at the Inter-University levels, the candidate should have been sponsored by a Zonal or District Association.
- Participation at the State Level, the candidate should have been sponsored by a Zonal or District Association.

The performance of the candidates in sports that are included in the All India Inter-University Competitions alone will be considered. Sports like Rifle Shoots, Karate, Judo etc. will not be considered. Students seeking admission under sports quota should be below 25 years of age. The achievement of the candidates in sports in their UG course of study alone will be considered for selection.

UNIVERSITY TRANSPORT FACILITY

A full fledged transport department is functioning under the public relations office (PRO) of the Bharathiar University with buses to provide transport facility to university students as well as staff from various places. This service is offered to ensure a hassle-free and safe transportation. University operates seven buses for providing transport facility to students and staff from various places for the convenient and welfare of them. University collects minimum bus fee from the students and staff on monthly basis.

ANNA CIVIL SERVICES COACHING ACADEMY

Anna Centenary Civil Services Coaching Academy is functioning through the funding of Anna Institute of Management, Chennai, Govt. of Tamil Nadu. About 60 trainees from Coimbatore, Nilgiris, Tirupur, Salem, Krishnagiri, Dharmapuri, Namakkal, Madurai, Ramanathapuram, Vellore and Thiruvannamalai districts are undergoing Civil Services Preliminary examination coaching under this institute, functioning inside the University campus. The Coaching is residential in nature. Due to the presence of this centre, Civil Services aspirants all over the Western zone and South Zone of Tamil Nadu have been getting free coaching for the Civil Services Exams. Since its inception, 19 trainees have passed the Preliminary Examination of Civil Services and have joined in All India Civil Services Coaching Centre, Govt. of Tamil Nadu, Chennai for their Mains and Personality test. In addition to this, 21 trainees who had undergone coaching under this Institute have been selected as Inspectors of Intelligence Bureau, Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India through Fast Track Selection process. As well, a trainee Mr. Venkatesh Prabhu has been selected as the topper in the country as Flying Officer through the Fast Track Selection conducted by the Staff Selection Board of Dehradun and serving at Assam as a Flight lieutenant. More than 100 trainees of this coaching academy have become Group-I, Group-II officials and are serving in IAF, Paramilitary, Home Ministry, Judiciary, Secretariate and Public Sector Banks. Ms.R.Kalpana, a trainee of this institute has emerged as a topper in the South India in the Reserve Bank of India Officers's Exam. Miss.C. Vanmathi I.A.S., the trainee of this institute has secured 152 rank in UPSC and has been posted as a trainee Collector at Maharastra State and Dr.M.Thiyagarajan IAS., has been functioning as a Sub-Collector in Patna District, Bihar State. Mr.R. Sathish Kumar who has successfully passed in the UPSC Exam - 2016 is allotted Indian Revenue Services and undergoing training at Nagpur, Maharastra State.

UNIVERSITY HOSTELS

University Hostels

The Bharathiar University was established at Coimbatore by the Government of Tamilnadu in February 1982 under the provision of the Bharathiar University Act 1981. The University is located in the foothills of Western Ghats with lush green in 1000 acres of land. Walking through the Bharathiar University Hostel campus is an experience unlike any other. These hostel blocks together can house about 1700 plus students who stay on campus 700 for boys and 1000 for girls. This stately, elegant campus of 11 classic buildings, tree-lined walkways, and open, grassy courtyards and is the only top University in the state with a residential, self-contained campus. Girls and boys have separate blocks and each block has a fixed capacity. Boys hostel are located in the main campus and girls hostel are located in the Residential campus. Out of 11 hostels, four for boys, four for girls, two hostels are provided separately for Research scholars and one for international hostel for foreign students and Guests. The hostels are nestled in clean surroundings with open courtyards in most of them. There is also sufficient parking facility for bicycles and two wheelers. The Hostel campus design serves to strengthen the sense of community at the university, with the belief that the daily interactions of residential life only increase the potential for learning. The hostel provides the students with daily newspapers and various magazines to make them aware of the daily happenings of the world.

Equipments and amenities

University hostels are fully furnished with Cot, Purified hot and cold water, CCTV cameras, Solar Lights, Music System, Play Grounds, Gardens and Bore Wells. The Napkin Vending & Incinerator Machines are available in the girls hostel. Hostels are equipped with Garden chairs and Visitor Waiting hall on the green lushes and flowers for parents and offering the students a clean, comfortable and homely environment to the students. A spacious common room offers computers, LCD TV and other entertainment facilities to students. Guided study hour is maintained. Food is prepared and served in a neat and hygienic environment to the students. Guest rooms for visiting parents of students are also available. The hostel complex also houses small utility shops like stationery, bakery, laundry, and saloon. An experienced supervisor is there in each hostels, who ensures special care of the students.

Mess

Each hostel has its own dining mess, where breakfast, lunch and dinner is served for students. The mess is run by the student's representatives under the supervision of warden. Dividing system is followed to meet the expenditure pertaining to the mess. Mess charges will be around Rs.50 to 80 per day. Every month a student has to pay the charge ranging from Rs.1500/- to 2,400/- as mess bill in total. Residents going out of station for more than two days should apply for reduction in prescribed form to the supervisor at least one day in advance. Purified water from Reverse Osmosis plant is utilized for cooking and drinking. Hot water is also provided for drinking and bathing purposes.

Rooms

In all hostels every room is occupied by two to three students except Research scholar hostel. Each student pays Rs.210/- per month as room rent besides meeting the electric bill and water charges. Refundable caution deposit Rs. 8,710/- will be collected from students.

International Hostel

International Hostel is located in the university residential campus near children's park. Here the rooms are provided with a bed, mattress, desk, chair and cupboard for each student. Adequate dining facility is available for all students. Indoor games facilities for Table tennis, Badminton, Chess and Carrom board is available in the hostel. The hostel is provided with uninterrupted electricity, Solar-heated water facility, water cooler, common TV room and a common reading room. There are 45 furnished double bed rooms with attached toilet available to accommodate the foreign students, university examiners, distance education students, parents of the students and guests. A amount of Rs.200/- will be collected from Bharathiar university students, Rs.250/- from the guests of students and staff and Rs.300/- for other university and college students and guests production of valid ID card.

Sports facilities

Students with a passion for sports and who like to maintain a healthy lifestyle will be impressed with the facilities at Bharathiar University hostel. Outdoor facilities are protected with green PVC coated fencing with retaining wall & flood lights to all hostels grounds for Volleyball, Badminton, Kabaddi, Cricket, open courtyards for walking and Indoor facilities

with Badminton, Table Tennis, Chess and Carrom. The University Organizes an Inter-house competition for each hostel every year. The authorities appointed the additional charge for hostel sports and ground maintenance from the department of physical education.

Security System

Complete safety and security inside the hostels and on campus is ensured by block supervisors, wardens and chief wardens and by the security staff and the chief security officers on campus.

Medical facilities

University Hospital functions for the welfare of students in the University campus. The University hospital doctor will provide basic treatments for all the students of University and also for staff working in the University. A Pharmacy is also available in hospital to provide medicine for required persons. The University provides 24 hours ambulance facility, and a well equipped first aid centre under the care of a trained nurse. Emergency and major medical facilities are being arranged by the University hospital Doctors in nearby hospitals. Moreover as precautionary measure, fogging machine is used at regular intervals in all hostels to prevent mosquitoes in the campus.

Gardens

The University has a unique tropical mountain climate; hence the garden has an ideal climatic condition for the growth of Lawns and flowers. The Gardens beautify the hostel area and also provides a stree-free environment for the students. The gardens in the hostels consist different type of trees, lawns and flowering plants like Rose, Water Lilly, Nerium, Hibiscus, Allamonda, Vinca, Roselia, Crotons and ground covers Verbena. Garden chairs are placed in various places of the garden for the convenience of the students. The garden is visited by thousands of students and public throughout the year and even in winter, when it is not the flowering season.

Excellence in Hostel Life

It is needless to say that, hostel life has certain great attractions in addition to the freedom enjoyed by students through they have to abide by the rules of the hostel. Hostels provides a care-free atmosphere. The usual domestic life has plenty of responsibilities and

annoyances. Life in a hostel is community life. Students live together, as if it were a kind of family. In certain hostels two or even more students are accommodated in a room. In the same way they eat together during the dining time and go out together for entertainment, recreation or other purposes. Hostel life has a charm of its own. Students may come out the familiar surroundings of parents and dear ones and enter a new world of strangers, who also experience the same. However some basic etiquette can make the hostel life a memorable experience. They prove extremely useful to their future life.

Hostel Authorities

Bharathiar University has a separate hostel section under the management of the Hostel Management Committee, headed by the Vice – Chancellor. The Chief Warden, Bharathiar University, also the secretary of the Committee, administers the hostels. The hostel wardens are teaching faculty and are responsible for discipline, maintenance, allotment of rooms and any other help a student might need.

UNIVERSITY DATA CENTRE

Internet facility is provided to all the Faculty members, Research Scholars, Students and Officers of the University through 1 Gbps connectivity of National Knowledge Network (NKN) through BSNL. The optical Fiber cable connectivity for new academic and hostel buildings is newly established with WiFi facility through Campus Local Area Network project of National Mission on Education through Information and Communication Technology (NMEICT). The University Data Centre is in charge for LAN and provides the internet facility.

GREEN BOX

In order to redress the grievances of the students and other stakeholders, a system is introduced is the University by way of placing a "Green Box" at the entrance of the lobby. Grievances can be addressed to the authorities also through e-mail. The whole system of the redressal of grievance is directly handled by the Vice-Chancellor.

The Bharathiar University launched the Community College system in April 2007 and institutionalized the same as a statutory institution, named Bharathiar University Community College Consultancy Centre BU-(CCCC). The vision of the community college is to empower the disadvantaged and the underprivileged through skill development programs and make them gainfully employed. It mainly concentrates on the urban poor, rural poor, tribal poor and women online with UGC's initiative in this regard.

A Non commercial, Non-profit making and service minded organization can alone start and run the Community College. No individual is permitted to start the Community College. The Community College can be a Multi campus reality and it is the skill based education going to the people instead of the community moving towards this kind of education.

In order to rope in the disadvantaged persons, the Community College system envisages access, flexibility in curriculum and teaching methodology with cost effectiveness. The curriculum is designed to strengthen Life Skills, Work Skills, Internship and Preparation for employment.

Bharathiar University Community College is one among the best Community College stream of Indian Universities to offer around 30 diploma programmes. A pass in 10th standard is the eligibility. At present there are 13 approved Community Colleges under Bharathiar University. Initiatives are being taken to give approval to the well established, renowned and service oriented trusts, societies and educational institutions in the years to come to train the unemployed poor youth and deserved persons to become skilled and employable. CENTRE FOR COLLABORATION OF INDUSTRIES AND INSTITUTIONS (CCII)

Bharathiar University was established at Coimbatore by the Government of Tamil Nadu in February 1982, under the provision of the Bharathiar University Act 1981 (Act 1 of 1981). The Act section 25 of chapter X1V empowers the syndicate to enter into an agreement with Central and State Governments and Private managements apart from specified purpose any other purpose not repugnant to the provision of this Act and also empowers to institute University Centres. Accordingly, the Syndicate of the University, in its meeting held on 08.11.2006, has approved to establish interaction with industry to undertake and conduct courses under University Industry Interaction programmes and later, the syndicate, in its meeting held on 23.06.2008, established the Centre for Collaboration of Industries and Institutions (CCII) as a constituent to identify and approve institutions to offer various Certificate, Diploma, PG Diploma, Advanced Diploma, UG and PG courses as Approved Institution Programmes under Centre for Collaboration of Industries and Institutions programmes, utilizing their faculties and facilities by entering into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU).

The CCII is an approved Institutional Programme Division under which industries are permitted to offer non-traditional / para professional / vocational / industry oriented Diploma, Post Graduate Diploma, Degree and Post Graduate Degree Programmes. The core aim of these programmes is to provide job opportunities by the Business Centres that offer the specialized courses.

Currently, there are 61 approved Centres under CCII with student strength of around 22,844. CCII is also planning to collaborate with more Centres. It is conducting Certificate Courses for school students also. The customized programmes offered under CCII are career oriented. The conversion rate of the students in job opportunities is almost 100%.

The Main Objectives of CCII are:

- > To promote linkage between University & various Industries
- > To innovate and offer educational programmes in various disciplines with synergistic interaction with the Industry and society
- > To integrate working environment, where students and faculty along with industry experts involve in Teaching Learning

Model aptitude question papers are available for use. The Department has signed with TCS, UTL Technologies, Infosys and HCL for the preparation of curriculum and faculty training. The UGC has allotted grants to run B.Voc. programmes.

FREE EDUCATION SCHEME

Bharathiar University has implemented free education for poor and talented students from the Academic year 2007-2008. Students desirous of joining various under-graduate courses can approach the affiliated colleges for admission. The affiliated Colleges have already given their consent to admit students under 'Free Education Scheme'.

The University is implementing the scheme to ensure opportunities for the talented poor students in the Post-graduate courses offered in the University Departments and students can approach the Head of the Department concerned for admission under this scheme.

ELIGIBILITY

Merit-cum-economic status is the main criterion for the selection of the students. Preference will be given to those students who come under the following categories:

Parental Status: Orphan, Destitute, Single Parent, Son or Daughter of

divorcees, children supported by NGOs.

Social Status : Community, Rual/Urban.

Economic Status: Income of the parent(s), guardian, property/assets of the

family.

Academic Status : Marks in S.S.L.C., +2, Under-Graduate Degree programme and

consistent performance and extracurricular activities.

The prescribed application can be downloaded from the University website (www.b- u.ac.in) and the filled-in application be sent to the respective Principal of the affiliated College for admission to the College and the Head of the Department concerned for admission to the University Department, may be sent on or before the due date.

Those who are already admitted under this scheme in any one of the affiliated colleges of Bharathair University are not eligible to apply to the courses offered in the University Departments.

A separate counseling will be conducted to select the students under this scheme.

- ❖ The Committee is open to receive complaints from female/staff/faculty of Bharathiar Unvirsity, Coimbatore.
- ❖ The Victim and the offender should belong to this University campus.
- Complaints will be received in person or through registered post.
- ❖ Complaints can be lodged by the victim or parents/guardian of the victim.
- ❖ Proper enquiry/investigation will be initiated within 5 working days.
- ❖ Depending upon the complaint, course of action will be taken and recommendation will be forwarded to the University authorities for necessary action against the offender(s).
- Necessary steps will be taken to follow up the implementation of the recommendations and disposal of the complaint.
- Statistical data of cases handled by the Committee will be sent to the Ministry of Human Resource Development every year.
